

# Level 2 Permit Application Procedures Specific to the Interstate Movement of Helicoverpa zea Commonly Known as the Corn Earworm

### Introduction

The USDA provides corn earworms for educational purposes through Texas A&M under the direction of Dr. Craig Wilson. Teachers can obtain the worms free of charge and allow their students to observe the metamorphosis from larva to adult. The program is supported with an educational website containing printable resources at:

Due to the larva's destructive nature to local agriculture crops, APHIS has placed this specimen on the Level 2 plant pest list. Teachers outside of Texas must obtain a Plant Protection and Quarantine Permit (PPQ) number 526 at Level 2 clearance in order to receive and maintain the worms. The following is a guide through this process.


# Step 1 USDA/APHIS Registration

Permits can be obtained electronically through the USDA's web based eAuthenication system located at <a href="http://www.aphis.usda.gov/permits/">http://www.aphis.usda.gov/permits/</a>. Remember to register for a Level 2 clearance. Click on the right side panel as indicated in Figure 1 by the solid arrow below:



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The ePermit webpages were recently updated and have a new look.




## Step 2 Visit local office

After completing the eAuthentication application on line, locate and visit the nearest Local Registration Authority (LRA) office. Official photo identification will be needed for validation. Within the online application process, there will be a link to finding a local office.

There is a small time lag after this verification phase before the online permit application can began.

## **Step 3 Complete Application**

After setting up the eAuthenication account and waiting the specified time, login at the link indicated in Figure 1 by the outlined arrow then click on Create Application as shown in Figure 2 below by the solid black arrow:



The process is guided with prompts and will send an email to confirm or inform of inappropriate or missing information. The local APHIS office will help you through the process.

# Step 4 Submit Permit

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# Permits and Certifications

APHIS issues permits for the import, transit and release of regulated animals, animal products, veterinary biologics, plants, plant products, pests, organisms, soil, and genetically engineered organisms.

ePermits is a web-based system that allows users to submit import /interstate movement/transit/release permit applications, track applications, apply for renewals and amendments, and receive copies of their permits. Learn more about ePermits.



APHIS also issues some certifications as a service to United States exporters.

#### **Animal and Animal Products**

Includes live animals, semen, embryos and materials derived from animals or exposed to animal-source materials such as animal tissues, blood, cells or cell lines of livestock or poultry origin, RNA/DNA extracts, hormones, enzymes, microorganisms including bacteria, viruses, protozoa, and fungi. In addition, animal materials including dairy products (except butter and cheese), and meat products (e.g., meat pies, prepared foods) from countries with livestock diseases exotic to the U.S.

Includes vaccines, bacterins, antisera, diagnostic kits, and other products of biological origin. \_

### Plants, Organisms, and Soil

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# Register to Use ePermits

To access ePermits, you must have a USDA eAuthentication account. eAuthentication is a registration system that enables customers to access USDA Web applications and services via the Internet.

The USDA eAuthentication system supports different levels of authentication. ePermits requires a Level 2 authentication for most permit applications.

Exceptions to the Level 2 requirement are made for the APHIS Form 2005 (Application for Permit for the Research and Evaluation or Transit Shipment of Veterinary Biological Products) and also for some biotechnology epermits and notifications. #### eAuthentication Account Restrictions:

- After 180 days with no login, your USDA eAuthentication password will expire. To use the system again, contact ATAC to unlock your password:

- After 400 days with no login, your USDA eAuthentication account will be disabled. To unlock your account, contact the eAuthentication Helpdesk:


