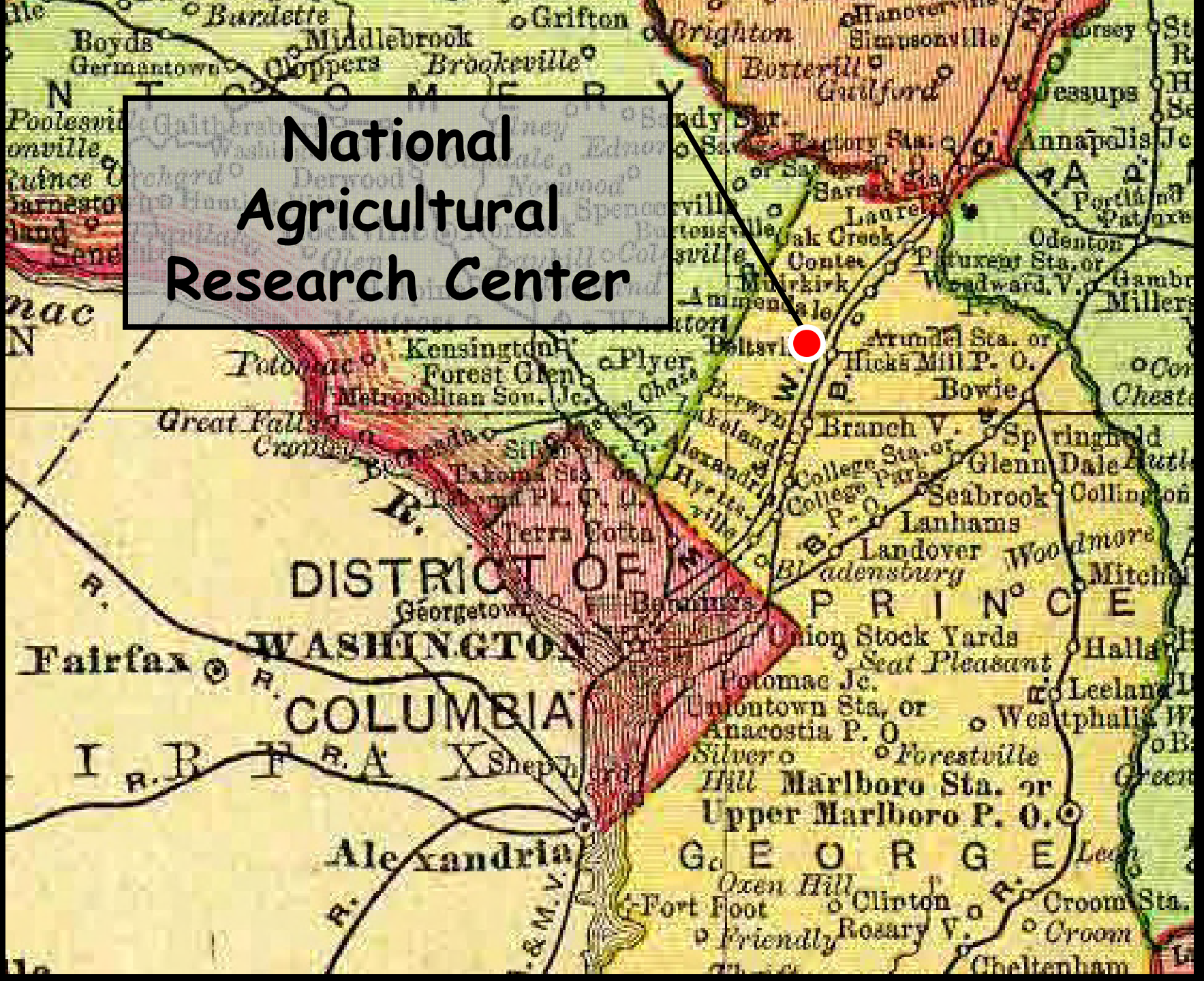

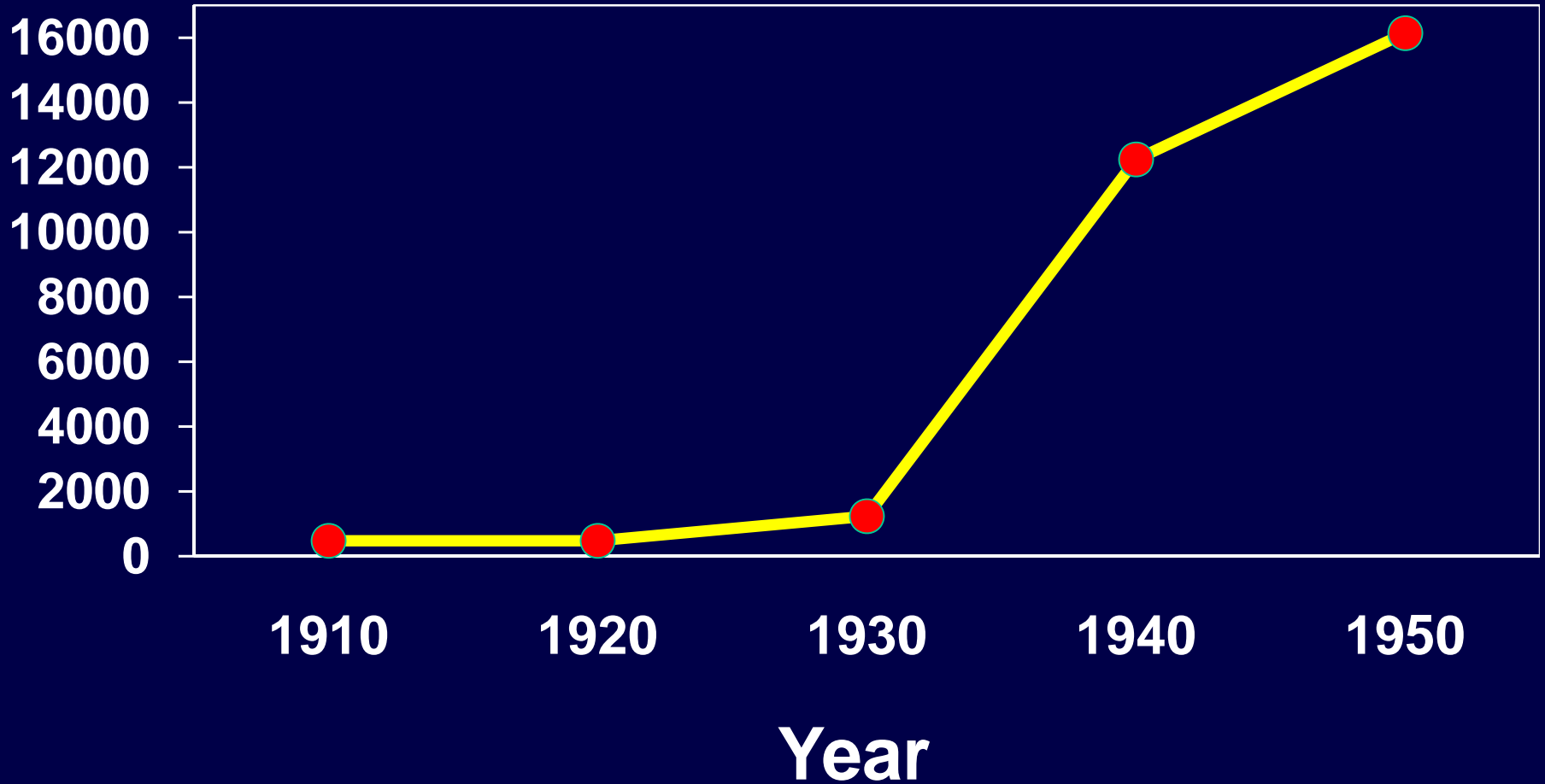

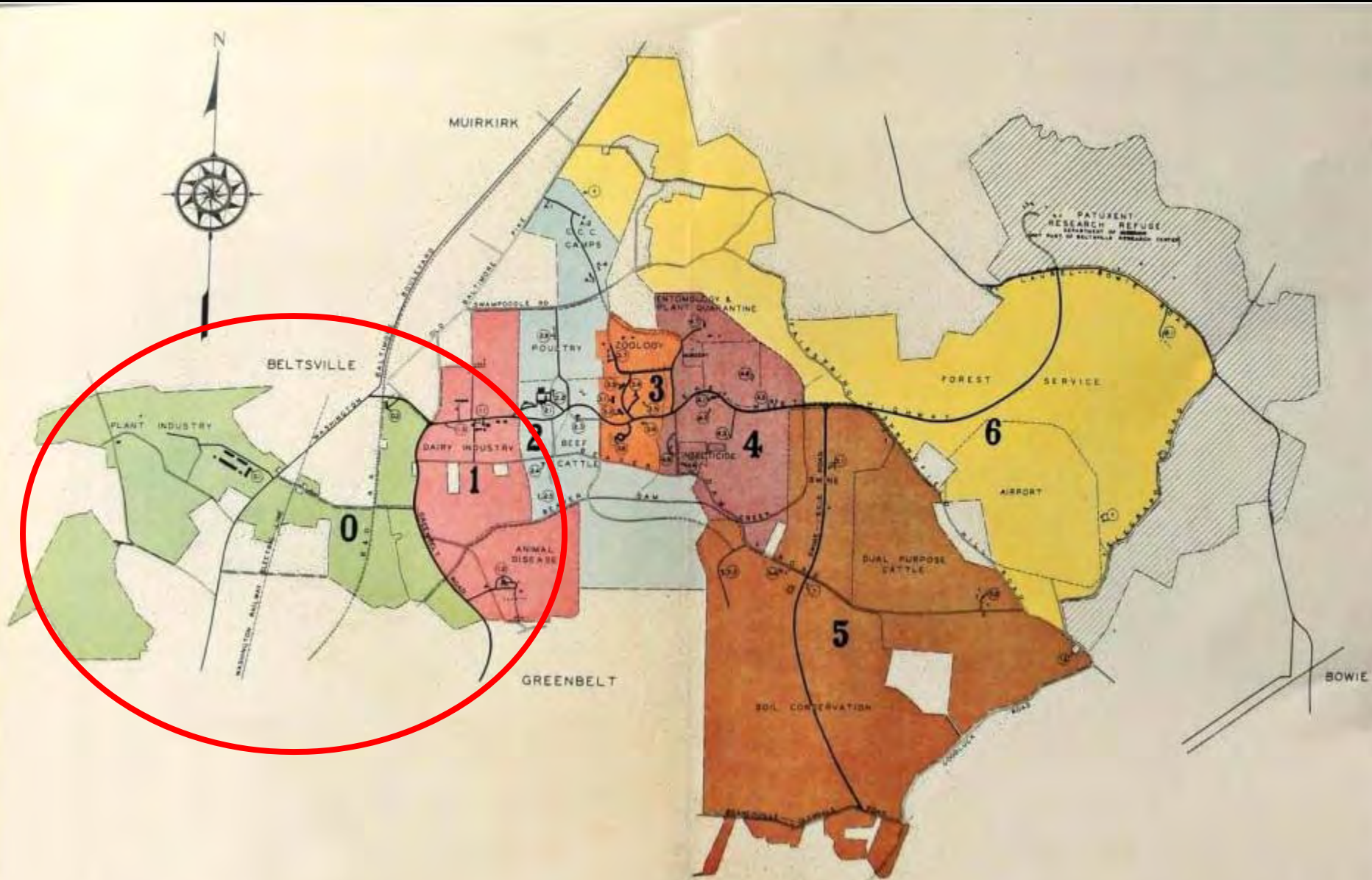


**Beginning in 1910, the

Bureau of Plant Industry moves to National Agricultural Research Center

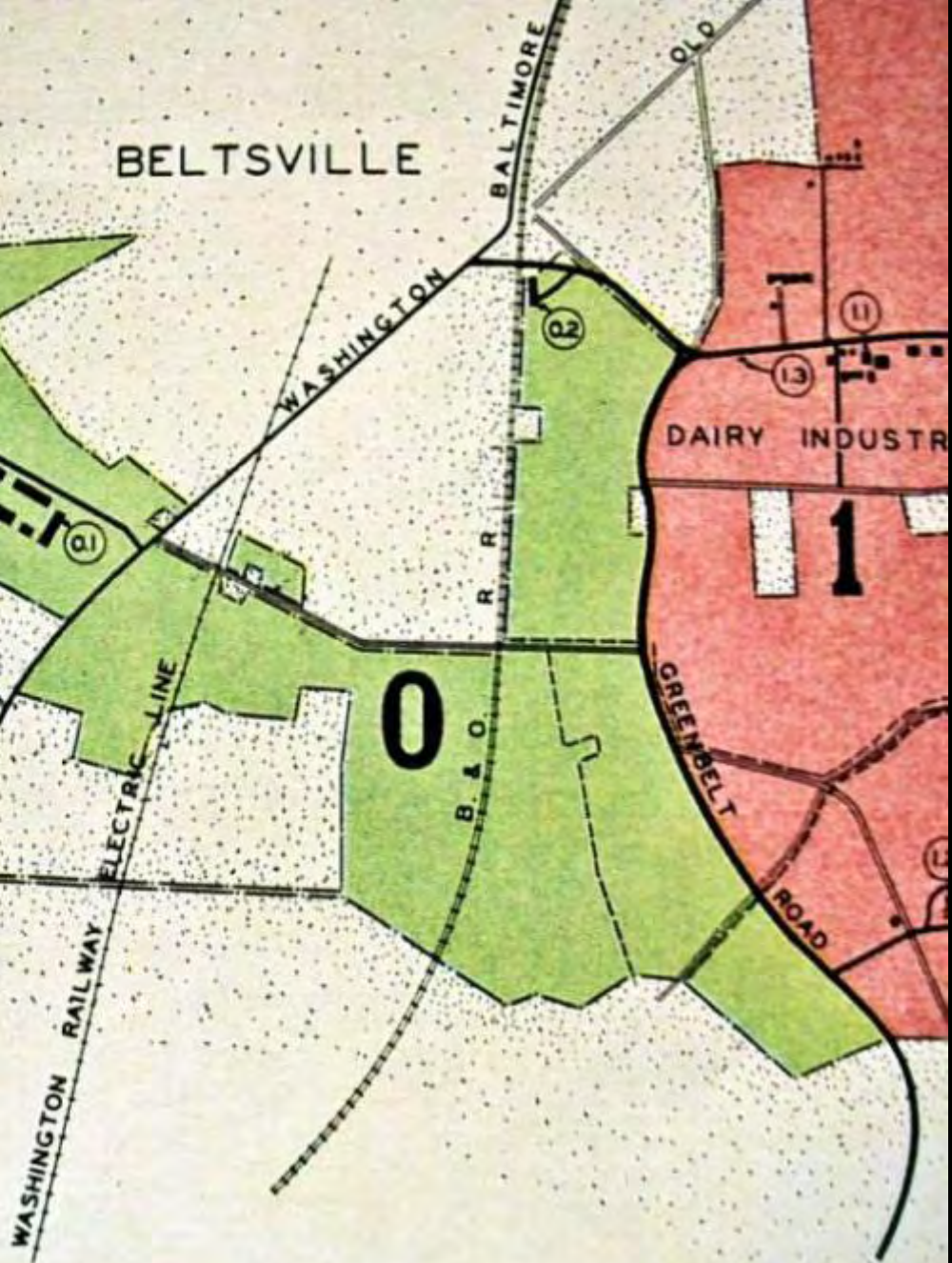

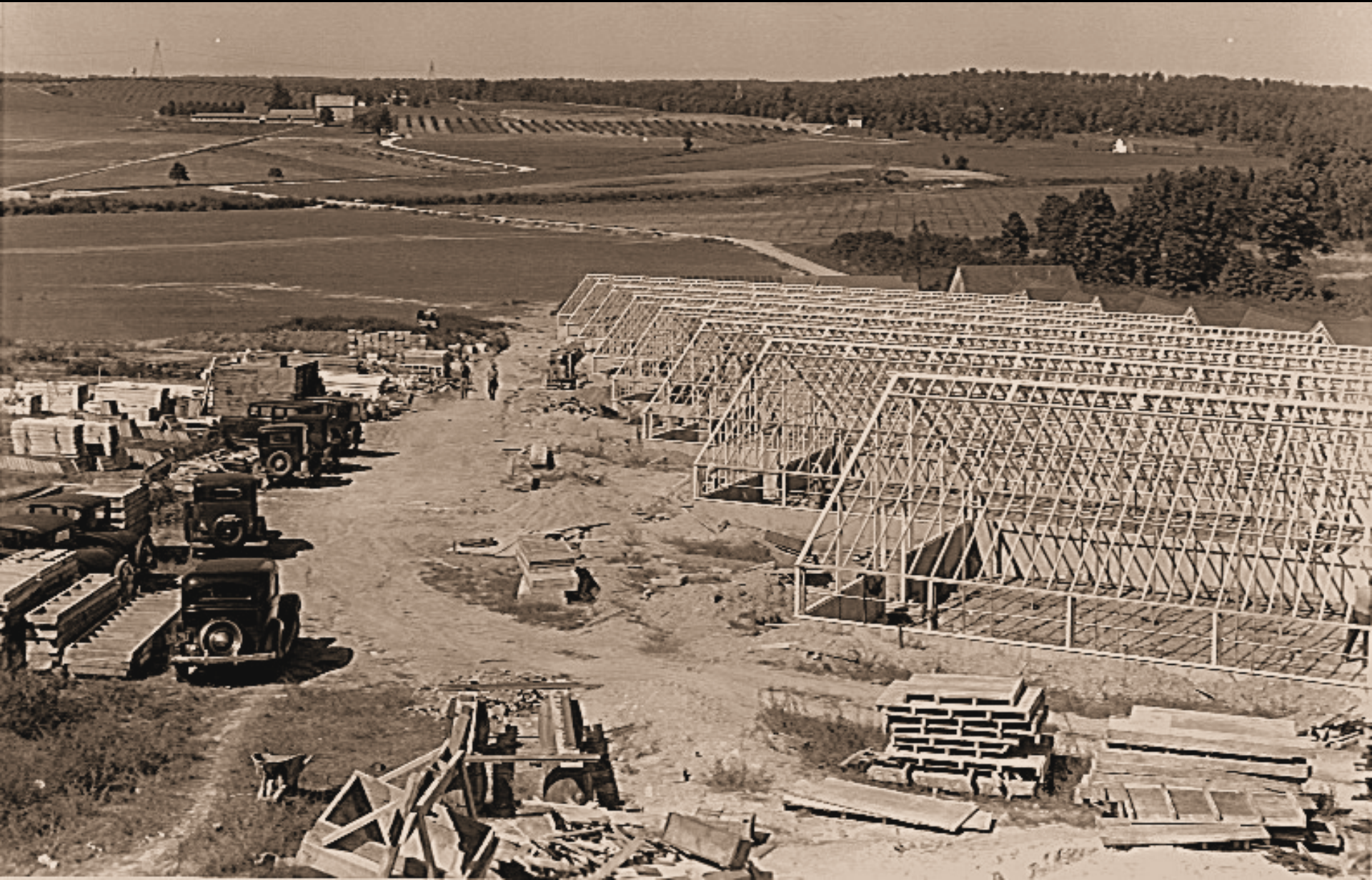

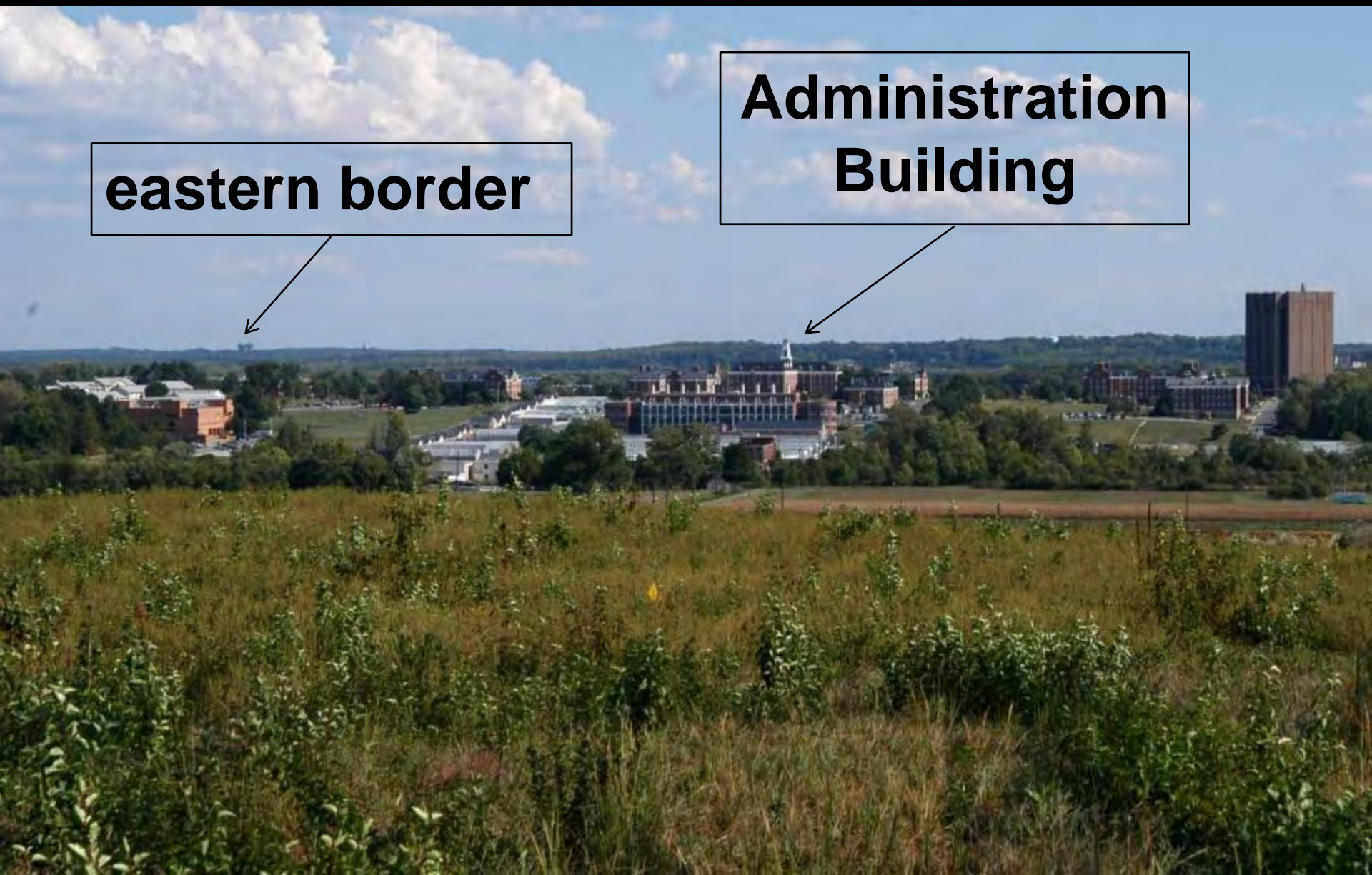
